## Chair's Update

Another year disrupted and life still hasn't returned to what it was pre-Covid. After lockdown last Christmas we didn't manage to get properly started again until March, but since then we have been very busy. During the year we have enrolled and an extraordinary 31 new Associates. Compare that to only 12 last year, which wasn't entirely surprising, and 22 in 2019 and 20 in 2018.

We do still have a waiting list, but this has been much reduced over the year, with a fierce focus on ensuring that all Observers were working well with Associates and that new Observers were recruited and trained from amongst the members. During the year, six new Observers qualified as Local Observers and two Local Observers as National Observers, taking us to 22 Observers in total with a further four trainee Observers going through the process now. This ensures that the Club remains in excellent shape to continue to offer Advanced training to Associates.

The membership currently stands at around 120. A huge amount of work has gone into running the club during the last year and I'd like to thank all those involved. Of course, that includes the Observers who turn out every other Saturday to give their time, but also everyone involved in managing the membership enquiries, assessment rides, check rides and group rides, keeping the Facebook page and website up to date and arranging the Winter Club evenings.

We have a full timetable planned for the coming year, so keep an eye on the Facebook page and emails and get involved, enjoying what the club has to offer. We're hoping to send a quarterly newsletter, so if you have any tales to tell or information to share, please get in touch.
